Planning and teaching continues to be developed in literacy and mathematics. Improved monitoring structures have been implemented focusing on areas for improvement Strategies/approaches have been demonstrated and observed ensuring consistency of approach across the school. |
| Staff training / Continuous Professional Development from outside consultancy | 1,2,3,4,5,6 | £3,797 | Training and professional development improves the skill set of teaching and support staff, enabling them to provide stimulating and challenging lessons for all children. (ICT, English, SEND) |
| Booster classes / extended school day and resources | 1,2,3,4,5,6 | £20,475 | Additional intervention and support for those children in Year 4, 5 and 6 needing to make accelerated progress, in order to meet targets and make better than average progress. |

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| Year 1 phonics intervention staff | 4,5,6 | £14,321 | Additional intervention for identified groups of pupils in phonics. A higher proportion of pupils reach national levels in Year 1 phonics test. |
| Additional teaching staff | 1,2,3,4,5,6 | £7,157 | The gap between actual levels and expected outcomes in literacy and numeracy will be lessened for CiC. To support children with barriers to learning. To enable Year 6 to work in smaller groupings, supporting behaviour and teaching and learning therefore enhancing progress in all areas. To enable Year 5 to work in smaller groupings, supporting behaviour and teaching and learning therefore enhancing progress in all areas. To close the gap in maths for those identified as not making satisfactory/good progress from KS1. |
| Higher Level Teaching Assistants | 4,5 | £53,480 | Additional intervention and support for those children needing to make accelerated progress in order to meet targets and make better than average progress. |
| Staff for extra - curricular activities | 4,6 | £13,592 | Before and after school clubs at no cost to pupils, to enhance pupil engagement. Achievement and participation will improve for disadvantaged children. |
| Provision of milk and fruit for KS2 pupils, healthy refreshments for pupils in booster class, hygiene items for pupils, Mock SATS breakfast | 6 | £6,714 | Fruit provided for all pupils as one of their 'five a day' – a good source of nutrients to contribute towards a healthy, balanced diet to encourage healthy eating habits into later life. Milk is provided in line with DFE school food standards. This boosts their calcium intake and increases hydration levels, improving their ability to concentrate and learn. Refreshments provided during booster classes to aid energy and concentration. Personal hygiene items results in improved wellbeing and personal awareness. |
| Provision of uniform | 6 | £1,725 | To provide pupils with appropriate uniform (uniform package given to those children in receipt of FSM/CiC). |
| Christmas 2020 events and Summer 2021 events. Craftwork quotes. | 4,6 | £8,254 | Improved achievement and participation for disadvantaged children. To enhance life experiences for all pupils. |
| Website safety advice. | 6 | £500 | To set up Google Classroom. |
