Introduction.



At Leagrave Primary School, we believe that everybody's health, safety and wellbeing are really important. We respect each other and



we want to keep all children safe and to protect their rights.

We have a Safeguarding Children and Child Protection Policy for all the adults at our school but this 'child friendly' policy is for all the children who attend Leagrave Primary School. It is designed for children to read and should be read as a guide to the main policy. It does **not** replace it.

Safeguarding means that we will:

- Protect you from harm;
- Make sure nothing stops you from being healthy or developing properly;
- Make sure you are safely looked after;
- Make sure you have the best life chances and can grow up to be happy and successful.



How do we keep you safe?



- We provide a safe and secure place in which you can learn.
- We help to ensure that you are safe at home as well as at school.
- We want you to know where to get help if you are worried or unhappy

Staff and Visitors



All adults at our school have to sign in at the office and wear a lanyard or a sticker to say who they are. Tell a grown up if you see a grown up who isn't.

Do you need to talk?

You may want to talk to your parent/ carer or another trusted grown up but remember you can also talk to any adult in school if you are worried or don't feel safe!

There are also some adults who are responsible for making sure that everyone is safe and well cared and you can talk to them. They are:
