School Uniform

When the children return to school in September, they will need to be wearing full school uniform and have complete P.E. kits.

Please find a reminder of the uniform below:

Boys

- Charcoal grey trousers (not made of stretchy material)
- Green polo shirt with Leagrave Primary School logo
- Green jumper with Leagrave Primary School logo
- Black or grey socks
- Black school shoes (no boots, trainers or trainer style shoes)
- No designs in hair and long hair must be tied back.

P.E. Kits

- Black sports t-shirt with school logo
- Black shorts
- Black cotton jog pants with school logo (optional in summer)
- Black zipped hoodie with school logo (optional in summer)
- Trainers
- Spare pair of socks
- All labelled and in a Black P.E. bag with school logo

All Children Must Have:

- Green book bag
- Labelled water bottle

Girls

- Charcoal grey skirt, trousers or pinafore (not made of stretchy material)
- Green polo shirt with Leagrave Primary School logo
- Green jumper/cardigan with Leagrave Primary School logo
- Plain white ankle or knee length socks
- Grey/black tights in the winter
- Black school shoes which are flat (no boots, trainers or trainer style shoes)
- Black/green headscarves
- Hair must be tied back

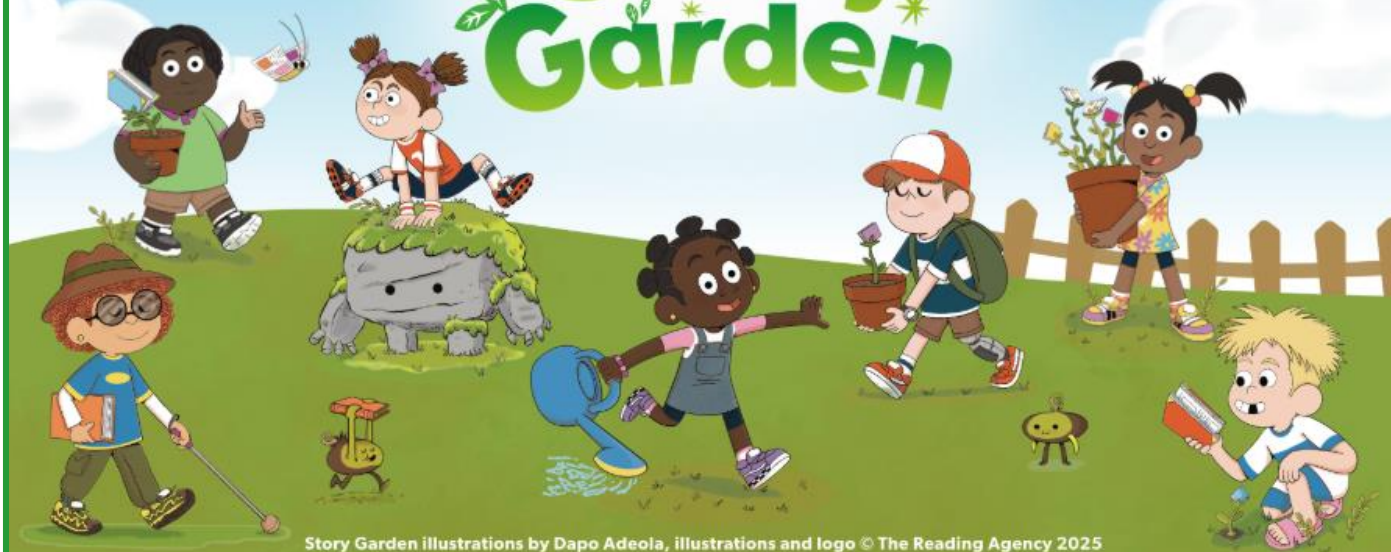
Antisocial Behaviour

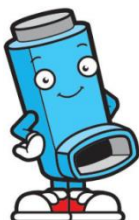


Early Years Reminder
