### Year 6 RAF Museum Trip

On Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> September, Year 6 went to the RAF Museum, Hendon. They took part in two really exciting workshops, where they got to learn about Daphne Pearson, who was an Auxiliary Air Force officer during the Second World War (she was awarded the George Cross) and Bernard Kregor, who served on ground crew in Bomber Command. Our children had the opportunity to wear uniform that was worn by people who served in the war!

They then went back in time and walked the steps of an Air Raid Warden - they even had to evacuate to a bunker (it was like living in WW2).









After their exciting morning, children were able to explore the museum to learn about different aircrafts used during the war and people who played a key part in fighting for the RAF.

A school council is a formal group of pupils who act as representatives of their peers in discussing school issues with the Headteacher and staff. It is a brilliant way of representing and contributing to Pupil Voice in school. The School Learning Council plays an important role at Leagrave Primary School. It gives a voice to all pupils. The committee is made up of fifteen children: one representative per class. Each class holds a ballot and each child votes for their representative.

The council meets once every two weeks to discuss suggestions, organise school events or plan fundraising activities. Regular school attendance is important in giving children the best possible start in life. Leagrave Primary school is committed to working hard to improve the attendance and life chances of our children and will:

- Challenge poor attendance, particularly persistent absenteeism
- Support pupils/families to explore reasons for absence and develop solutions for improving attendance
- Reward pupils where attendance is excellent

Research shows that poor level of attendance at primary school can:

- Significantly reduce the chance of students attaining 5 good GCSE's in secondary school
- · Lead to increased chances of poor mental health in adulthood
- Result in difficulties developing and maintaining secure relationships with peers/adults

Please can all entries be given to Mrs Khan in 15K by Friday 7th November 2025.




Times Tables Rock Stars is an excellent resource that we have available for children to practise their times tables online! It is a fun and exciting way for children to become fluent at their times tables
